
Readers Roundtable






Mom 'n Tot Club

It's a hit, and along the way Tru competes to keep her husband; deals with her irrepressible mom, Naomi (a former Miss New York Subway), after her life-changing heart attack; and discovers

her daughters are competing for the same wicked eighth-grade heartthrob. The multigenerational antics are a light, enjoyable romp.


