No meetings...no deadlines...just GOOD books! Perfect for someone crunched for time. Book selections each month include discussion questions, patron reviews and author information.

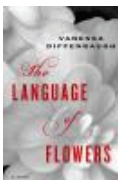

Strategies for Maximizing Your Retirement

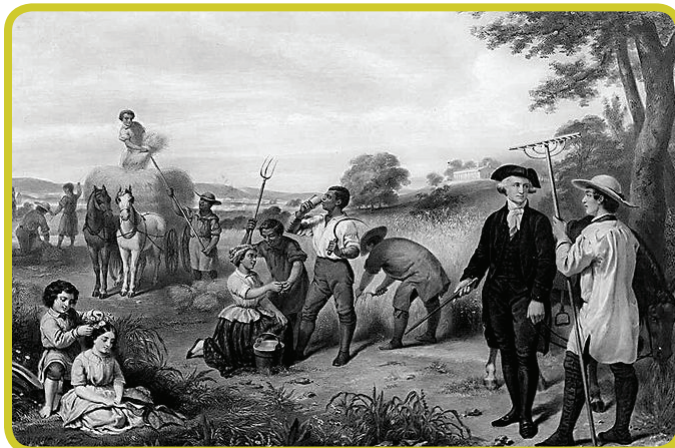
Tuesday, March 10, 1 pm

Tuesday, May 12, 1 pm

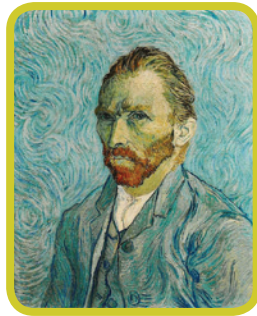
