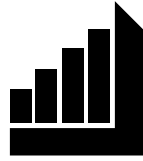

### July 14

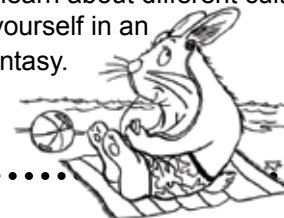
