

### Catapult those Marshmallows



**March 23**, Make a mini catapult and test your marshmallow catapulting skills. Can you hit the target?

**Hotel Transylvania (rated PG) (91 minutes)**  
**March 13, 6:30 pm**, As a haven for his daughter Mavis, Dracula opens the Hotel Transylvania, where she and some of the world's most famous monsters Frankenstein and his bride, the Mummy and more can kick back in safety and peace. For Drac, catering to all of these legendary monsters is no problem but his world could come crashing down when one ordinary guy stumbles on the hotel and takes a shine to Mavis.

**Wreck-It Ralph (rated PG) (101 minutes)**
