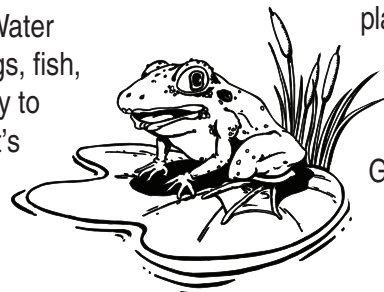
Take a dip in the Atlantic from Maine
