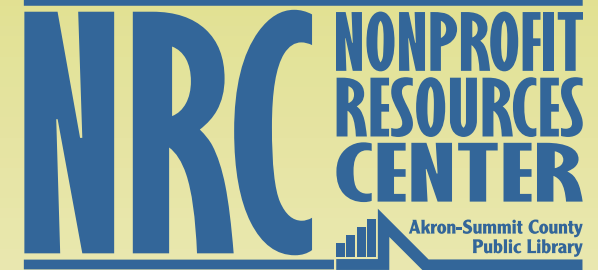

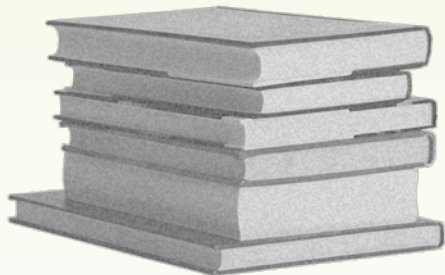

Also available: **Foundation Grants to Individuals Online**, which provides detailed information on 8,500 foundations that fund students, artists, researchers and other individuals.
