Interior Decorating

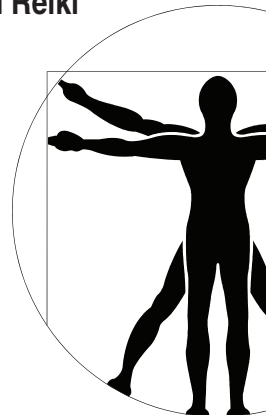
Wednesday, July 15, 7-8 pm
