Programs For Adults And Older Teens

HENNA TATTOOS WITH LISA HART

This program is for Adults and older Teens (16 yrs and up)

Henna is a natural dye made from ground leaves of the henna plant. It is applied as a paste that temporarily stains the skin for up to 3 weeks. Henna body art is a part of cultural celebrations in India, Pakistan, the Middle East, North Africa, and Southeast Asia. A henna artist applies the paste in beautiful patterns, that temporarily stains the skin for 1-3 weeks. In recent years, the art of henna, or "mehndi," has spread to the West, and is rapidly becoming part of our mainstream culture. Far more than just a "temporary tattoo," henna is unique as a social art form, and is rich in culture and history. Henna artist Luna Hart has been doing henna body art for seven years, and loves sharing the technique as a safe, natural, and **temporary alternative to permanent tattoos**. She will also bring aftercare sheets so the participants will know how to care for their henna for the best outcome. Space is limited. Please call 330-745-6126 to register. Wednesday, October 23

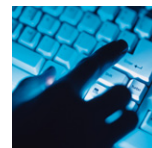
Learn how to make better use of search engine features for more successful Internet searching. Practice saving your favorite websites and printing Internet content.
