Children's Programs

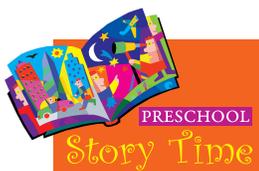
Preschool Story Time

Book Club on the Go

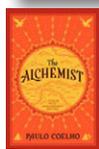
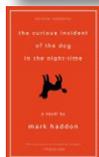
Do you like trying new books but don't have the time for group discussions?

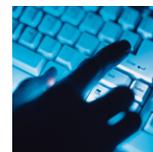

Computer Classes

Tuesday, October 20, 6 pm Internet, Part 2: Searching, Printing, and Favorites. Learn how to make better use of search engine features for more successful Internet searching. Practice saving your favorite websites and printing Internet content.

Thursday, October 22, 6 pm Internet, Part 3: Beyond Searching. Now that you know how to search for information, it's time to discover what else the Internet is used for. Topics covered include weather, movies, driving directions, games, and finding cheap gas.

Saturday, October 24, 10 am Open Lab: Come with your questions! Practice what you've learned in class! Open lab time is an opportunity to work on computers in the lab with an instructor present to answer any questions you may have.
