




March 4 THE ADVENTURES OF HUCKLEBERRY FINN by Mark Twain

In the course of their perilous journey, Huck and Jim meet adventure, danger and a cast of characters who are sometimes menacing and often hilarious.

In the fourth book in her "Masters of Rome" series, McCullough details Caesar's rise to power from 68-58 B.C. Caesar repeatedly outmaneuvers his enemies, who devise one scheme after another to bring about his political, economic, and social downfall.



CLARA DRISCOLL AND THE TIFFANY GIRLS

Thursday, March 12, 6:30 pm

Celebrate Women's History month and discover the story of Clara Driscoll, the recently discovered artistic genius behind the famed designs of the Tiffany Glass Studios. Driscoll was born Clara Pierce Wolcott in 1861 in Tallmadge, Ohio. Linda D. Alexander, fourth cousin to Driscoll, will share the discoveries that led to identifying Driscoll as the designer of many of the firm's iconic lampshades. They also bring to light the role of the "Tiffany Girls" who worked under her supervision.

While it has been one hundred years since Clara last stepped foot in the Tiffany Studios, working for Louis Comfort Tiffany from 1888-1907, the local connection is exciting and the fact that she is gaining the recognition that is long overdue.

1944. World War II. Colorado. Livy Dunne (Kerri Russell) has been thrown out of her home by her father, Rev. Dunne, because she's pregnant and unmarried. She's banished to rural Colorado to go through with an arranged marriage to a lonely farmer so her child will have a father. When she arrives in the tiny town, Livy and her betrothed are wary of each other. Worldly Livy is bored by Ray and the hardscrabble life he leads – despite his inherent goodness and wisdom. As the months pass, Livy learns more about this calm, practical self-effacing farmer. Slowly almost imperceptibly, Livy realizes she may have found "home" quite accidentally.
