**PERENNIAL PLANT EXCHANGE**

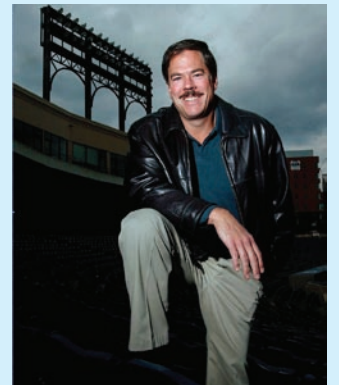
