Join Kim Lucak, DOVE Chocolatier as she explains what tempering chocolate is about and the differences between the different types of chocolate! Learn how





IRIS FOLDING CRAFT

Iris folding is a fun way to make beautiful greeting cards or works of art. Originating in Holland, early craft persons made their designs using patterned paper cut from the inside of envelopes. Today, crafters assemble light weight colored papers using a technique that involves folding strips in a way that creates a spiral design. The center forms an iris -- a shape reminiscent of the iris of an eye or a camera lens.
