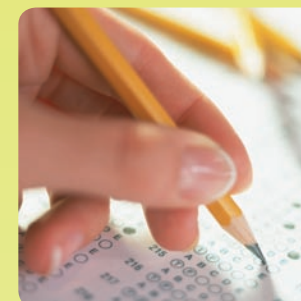

Thursday, April 7, 6:30 pm

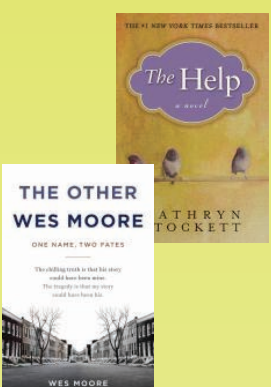
