#### **Wednesday, June 23, 6:30 pm**

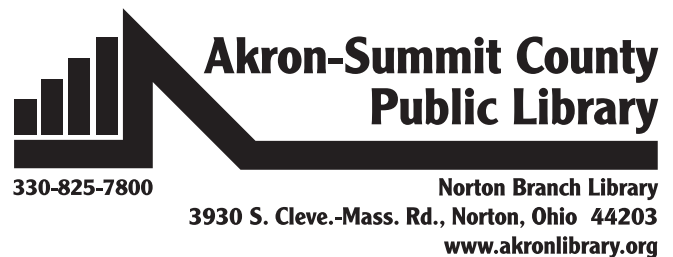
Once again we welcome actress and playwright Carol Starre-Kmiecik to our library in her one woman show as she portrays America's most famous female aviator - Amelia Earhart.

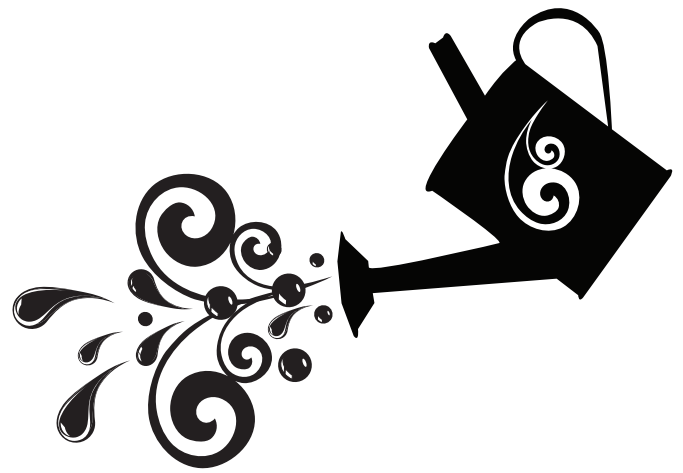

Mark Haddon has written a moving novel about love and bravery through the eyes of a British autistic boy. Christopher discovers his neighbor's poodle dead, impaled by a pitchfork, and, because he adores puzzles, he sets out to solve the mystery of who killed Wellington.

**July 7** FAMILY TREE by Barbara Delinsky.

When Dana and Hugh Clarke's baby is born into their wealthy, white New England seaside community, the baby's unmistakably African-American features puzzle her thoroughly Anglo-looking parents. The Clarke's relationship is put to the test while trying to untangle their family trees.

**August 4** RUN by Ann Patchett.

As the former Mayor of Boston, Bernard Doyle wants to see his sons in politics, a dream the boys have never shared.
