Carl Quatraro will discuss voting rights and restrictions in the U.S.; the 1848 Seneca Falls Convention, beginning of the women's suffrage campaign; how the 14th and 15th Amendments influenced the suffrage movement; the key women and organizations; notable Supreme Court cases; how World War I influenced the women's rights effort; and the ratification of the 19th Amendment in 1920.

Amelia Jenks Bloomer, was a suffragist better known for her promotion of "dress reform." After noticing the restrictive nature of clothing that Victorian women were required to wear, Bloomer pushed for women to adopt a more sensible, new style of dress. Yes, "bloomers" are named after her! The cultural changes wrought by Bloomer and her contemporaries paved the way for a new era of freedoms and rights for women, including the right to vote!
