


# Welcome!



## Local History Resources

Our local history collection includes a variety of materials pertaining to all aspects of Akron and Summit County history, including books, the *Akron Beacon Journal* and other local newspapers, photographs, clippings, and archival collections. We are also the repository for the document and photograph collections of the Summit County Historical Society.



## Summit Memory

## Local History Database

## Genealogy Resources

Our genealogy collection focuses on the eastern United States with an emphasis on Ohio, Summit County and surrounding counties. We also provide access to many online databases including Ancestry Library Edition, World Vital Records, and Fold3.
