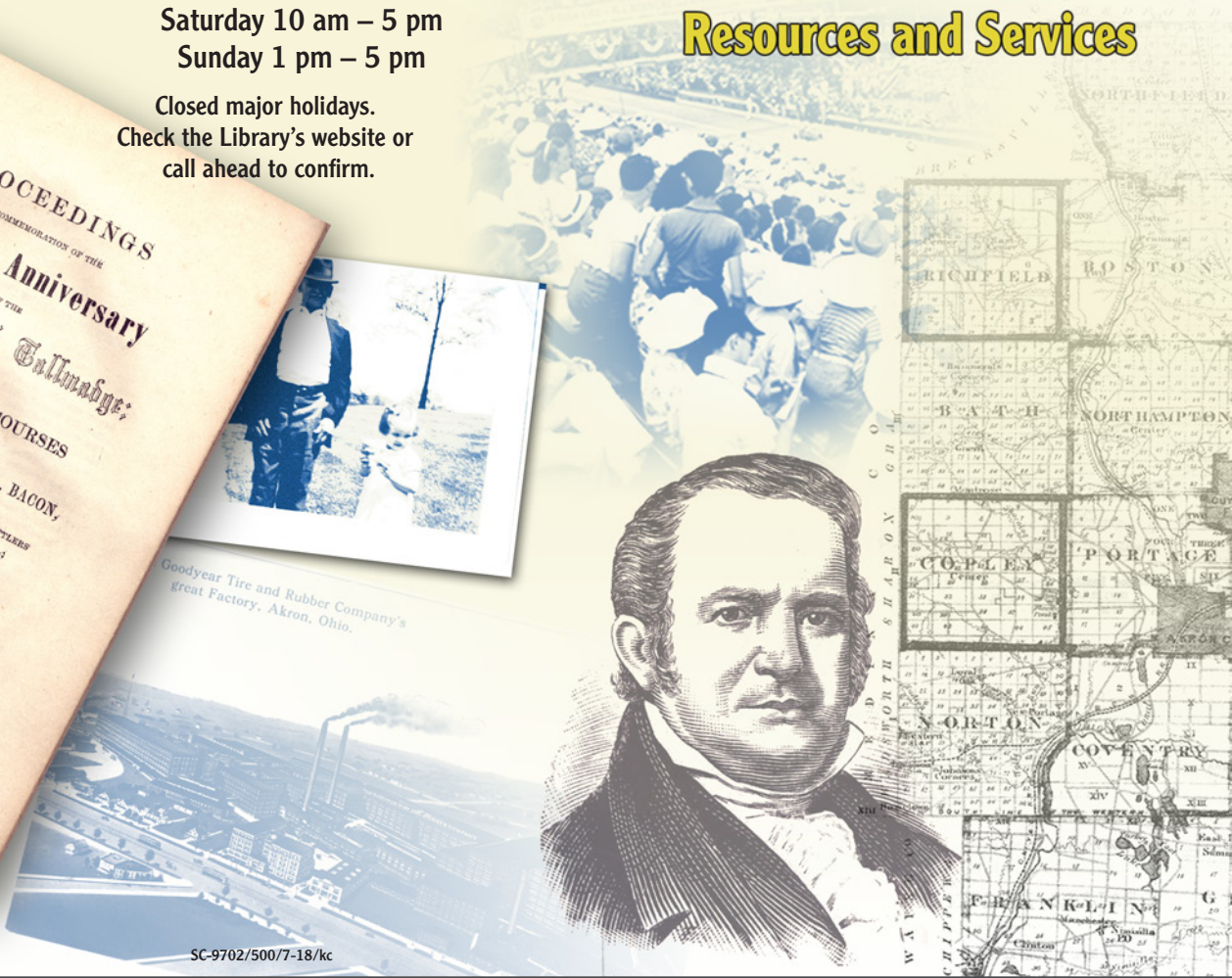

## Local History Resources

Our local history collection includes a variety of materials pertaining to all aspects of Akron and Summit County history, including books, the *Akron Beacon Journal* and other local newspapers, photographs, clippings, and archival collections. We are also the repository for the document and photograph collections of the Summit County Historical Society.



## Summit Memory

We offer microfilm reader/printers and scanners, a photocopier, and a document scanner. Bring change and dollar bills for photocopies and a flash drive to save scanned items. We have outlets and wireless internet access for those bringing laptops. Cameras and hand-held scanners are permitted. Food and beverages are not permitted.
