Fun and Humor in Mature Living

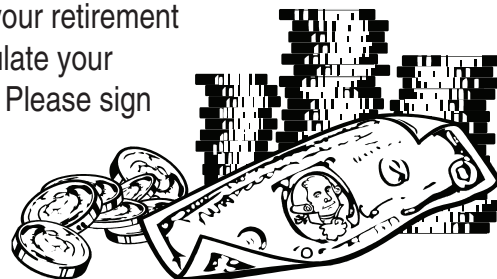
Wednesday, July 8, 6:30 pm
