

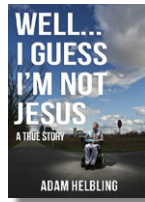
Library Events for All Ages

Thursdays, September 4, October 2, November 6, 3-4:30 pm

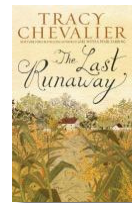
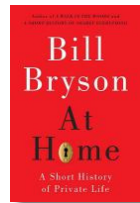

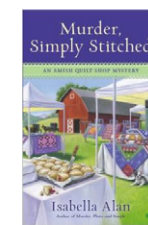
Local Author Talk Thursday, September 11, 6:30 pm
