Clean Out the Craft Closet

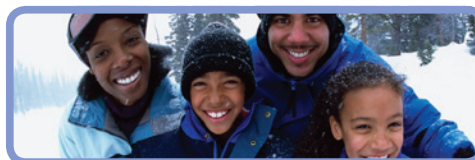
Tuesday, January 19, 4:30-5:30 pm
