Special Events:

12-3 pm Fanvid Exhibition (in the Children's Library/RECE Lab)

Take a look at some history and current practices behind the scenes of concept art with designer/illustrator and University of Akron Professor of Art, Dave Szalay. Dave Szalay is an accomplished designer/illustrator with an interest in storytelling and visual narrative. He has a BFA in Graphic Design and a

Master of Fine Arts.

Sequential Art refers to the use of pictures in storytelling. Perhaps our best examples are comic books and graphic novels. Matt Horak is a local cartoonist and illustrator who has done work for IDW Publishing, Wizards of the Coast, the National Inventors Hall of Fame/ Invent Now, and local guitar peddle manufacturer Earthquaker Devices.
